SOLIDARITY SUNDAY:

Development & Peace Caritas: People & Planet First: It is said that giving someone a fish feeds them for a day, but teaching them to fish, feeds them for life. But what can a community do if the waters it has expertly fished for generations start running out of fish? That was the situation in two villages in Cambodia until the partner, Development and Partnership in Action stepped in. With its focus on enabling people, it centered sustainable development and helped the villages establish community fisheries to save fish brook stocks and revitalize the river ecosystem. This helped families enjoy year-round food security and revitalize the river ecosystem. All of us who take part in the Eucharist are called to discover, through this sacrament, the profound meaning in our actions in the world in favor of development and peace and to receive from it the strength to commit ourselves ever more generously following the example of Christ, who in this sacrament, lays down his life for his friends.
