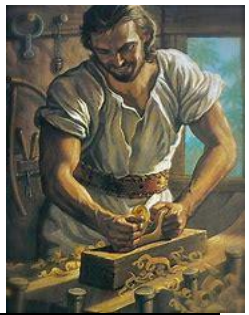

### Message From The Shrine

All are invited to attend our Annual Feast Day Celebration on Sunday, September 13th, here at Mother of Sorrows Pioneer Shrine in Mabou. The Continuous Rosary will be prayed at the Shrine starting at 1:00 pm and continuing until 3:30 pm. Mass will be offered by Father Danny MacLennan with Father Bernie MacDonald at 4:00 pm in St. Mary's Church, set up safely as it is for our weekend Masses. The intentions of "Friends of the Shrine" will be offered at the Mass.

To keep everyone safe we will have Public Health protocol in place; only 4 in the Shrine at one time, the rosary leaders will be designated to rotate

in and out, keeping only 4 persons in the Shrine at a time. The leaders will be amplified outside and those who attend will be seated outside. People will move to their cars if need be. Only two at a time in the gift shop in addition to staff. Washrooms are available.

Unfortunately we will not be providing that nice lunch and tea after Mass. We will hope and pray that we will be able to gather without all these restrictions again next year.

### Special Collections

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic and the restrictions faced by our churches, several Special Collections have been affected.

The Special Collections for Development and Peace, Collection for the Holy Land, and Collection for Pope's Pastoral Works (Peter's Pence) are now rescheduled for the fall.

#### September 13, Exaltation of the Holy Cross: *Collection for the Holy Land*

This special collection is traditionally reserved to help support Christian holy places and pilgrimage facilities in the Holy Land and the needs of the poor and vulnerable.

#### October 4, Memorial of St. Francis of Assisi: *Pope's Pastoral Works (Peter's Pence)*

This special collection is in support of the Holy Father's apostolic ministry to the Universal Church (canon 1271)

#### November 15, World Day of the Poor: *Development and Peace*

Development and Peace's theme for the fall will be "COVID-19: Recovering Together." They will be featuring stories of projects that have already been initiated to help people in the Global South respond to the pandemic. For example: to feed their families, many Haitian tradeswomen, known as "madam sara" in Creole, buy produce in rural areas and travel to cities to sell it. The wide travel and close interactions that their trade requires places the madam sara at an elevated risk

of catching and transmitting the virus. DPCC is helping Caritas Haiti provide food aid and pandemic prevention & care information to these women and their communities.
